FROM THE EXECUTIVE TEAM continued

As I am sure you have noticed the second transportable is here and well positioned in the school. It is just about ready to go, however as I requested a fresh coat of paint both inside and out, given it is 3 years old, there has been a slight delay - worth it in the long run I am sure you will agree. The plan is that the Year 3/4 Avocadoes and Arugulas will move into their new spaces sometime in Week 3. Thank you for your support with this.

Yesterday we had a wonderful day at Dickson Aquatic Centre for our annual swimming carnival. While a carnival on the second day of school didn't sound ideal at first, it was an awesome way to bring the senior school together quickly and have lots of fun. The House Captains were brilliant getting their Houses cheering and involved. Thanks once again to Mrs Emma Burris for her coordination of the carnival both at the end of last year and over the last two weeks. You are a gem Emma!

In regard to *Home School Partnerships* and clear communication with parents, there are three things I would like to highlight to start the school year.

- Firstly, **all classroom teachers will be using the Seesaw App** again this year. Please keep an eye out for information from the class teacher regarding getting on board with this fabulous way to gain an insight into the learning that is happening in classrooms.
- Secondly, all year levels will be running an **Information Session in Week 3, either on the Tuesday night for Kindergarten & Years 1/2, or the Thursday night for Years 3/4 & 5/6**. The purpose of these sessions is for you to gain insight into things such as the weekly routines for the classes, who the other teachers are that teach a specialist subject to that year cohort and any other special information.
- Thirdly, our annual **Getting to Know You Interviews will be held in Week 4**, the week commencing Monday, 22 February. This is the week after Information Sessions. These interviews are designed so that you get to pass on information about your child to the class teacher. It is a fabulous way to build relationships with you as we start the year.

Information about the Information Sessions and Getting to Know Interviews will be sent home next week.

Can I remind you that the car park on Grainger Circuit is for STAFF ONLY. Please do not park in it or on the grass in and surrounding it. Late last year, damage to underground pipes caused by parking on the grass due to the weight of vehicles, was an expensive repair bill for the school. It is vital that the safety of all students

remains at the forefront of everyone's minds, as you park anywhere around the school. So please park safely and legally.

In regard to COVID processes, we begin the year in a very similar way to the end of last year. **All visitors to the school MUST sign in on the school's COVID register at the office.**

This week as many of you are around dropping off and picking up to start the school year, I ask you to **please NOT enter the building unless absolutely necessary**. If you do, you will be asked if you have signed in at the office. Can I please remind and ask that if your child displays any symptoms (running nose, cough, temperature, sore throat or shortness of breath) to please keep them at home. The ACT Education Directorate is working to roll out the *Check In Canberra* App for use in schools, just as you use when visiting a café, restaurant or gym. I will let you know if this becomes available.

While many might say that they are glad that 2020 is over, I believe that 2020 was full of fabulous learnings, such as; we are a stronger together, schools are resilient places, and a smile goes a long way!

I look forward to learning and smiling with you throughout 2021.

STUDENT ABSENCES UNEXPLAINED ABSENCE TEXT MESSAGES

How to reply to a text message from our school?

If your child is absent from school and you receive an **Unexplained Absence text message**, would you please reply with the following information:

*(Insert CHILD'S FIRST and LAST NAME) from
(insert child's YEAR and CLASS) is away (TODAY or OTHER
DATES and TIMES if partial absence) due to (insert REASON)*

Some examples for absence reasons are:

Sick with the flu
Vomiting - tummy bug
Appointment with doctor/pediatrician/dentist
Family holiday

This will ensure that your child's absence is recorded with accurate information.

The same information is helpful if you advise the school by telephone of an absence before the start of the school day.

Important Reminders

PERMISSION NOTES FOR EXCURSIONS & EVENTS

Please return **ALL** permission notes, money or other notes to the school in an envelope or similar VIA YOUR CHILD'S CLASSROOM TEACHER. Please do not take notes directly to the office.

PAYMENTS FOR THE CANTEEN AND P&C (eg special lunches) **MUST be in a SEPARATE envelope** – please do not combine payments with any other school event. These payments should be given to your child's teacher also.

DIRECT DEPOSIT

If you are using Direct Debit for payments to the School's bank account, it is **most important** that you include the following in the reference field.

- © Student LAST NAME and FIRST INITIAL
- © EXCURSION TITLE or OTHER REASON for deposit

After making an online deposit, please return the signed permission note or form the next day.

ENTERING THE SCHOOL

If you are entering the school building ANY WHERE at ANY TIME of the day you are **required to sign in/out at the office** as either a registered or unregistered volunteer or visitor.

LATE TO SCHOOL

If your child arrives in their classroom after 9am parents/carers are required to come into the school with your child to sign them in at the office. Your child will be given a *Late Pass* to hand to their teacher.

COLLECTING YOUR CHILD EARLY

If you need to take your child out of school before 3pm or for an appointment during the day, please contact the office at least 30 minutes prior to the pick-up time so your child can be collected from their classroom to meet you at the office at the required time. This will ensure staff coverage of the office is maintained, especially at busy times of the day. An email or note to your child's teacher the day before is also a great way to notify the school of an early pickup.

ALLERGY AWARENESS - ANAPHYLAXIS

Anaphylaxis is a potentially life-threatening type of allergic reaction commonly caused by food allergies or insect bites/stings.

We have students with NUT, SESAME, FISH and EGG allergies in this school.

At Mount Rogers Primary School we do not provide, nor wish children to bring to school any:

NO NUTS all nuts and nut-based products (eg peanut butter, health bars, dried fruit mixes, snack packs, some biscuit varieties, some chocolates, pesto etc)

NO EGGS as boiled eggs or egg sandwiches

NO FISH including tuna, prawns etc

NO SESAME (eg hummus, health bars, vege chips, tahini, bread topping etc)

ACT Education Directorate STUDENT INJURY INSURANCE & AMBULANCE TRANSPORT

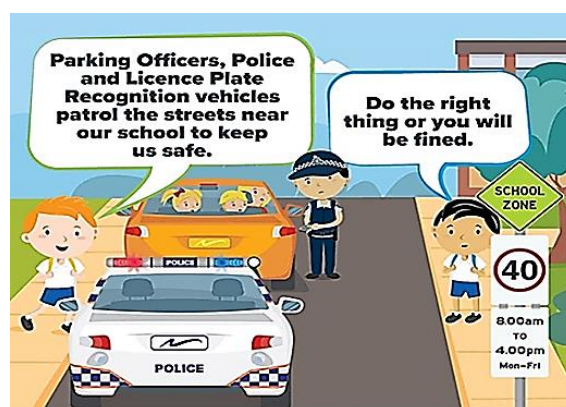
The Education Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury disease or illness was sustained.

As there is not automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for student who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity within the ACT.
