FROM THE EXECUTIVE TEAM

Dear Mount Rogers families,

A very warm hello from me and welcome to Winter. It is hard to believe that we are now over half way through the term. The school continues to hum as students work hard to deepen their understandings and show their learning to teachers. I was delighted to sit in one of the Kindergarten classes recently as students proved their understanding of words that rhyme, proudly leaving the room to go out to Break 1 with a pair of rhyming words – frog and log, sofa and gopher, lions and irons, parrots and carrots, fleas and peas and so on! If you haven't read *Oi Frog* by Kes Grey and Jim Field it is well worth it (spoiler alert - be aware that it does have the word 'bottom' in it!)

Following our recent School Board meeting I am delighted to announce our new School Board Chairperson is Cameron Pietsch, dad of Abby in Yr 3 and Eva in Yr 1, and our Deputy Chairperson is Chris McDevitt, dad of Tia in Yr 5 and Dane in Yr 2. Elisha Scholtes is the third parent representative, mum of Bailey in Yr 4, Lucas in Yr 3 and Imogen in Kindergarten. I thank these three for taking on this important role on behalf of the community. Our teacher representatives are Angela Donaldson Yr 5/6 Delta and Janelle Strain Yr 1/2 Pluto. The School Board meets twice a term to monitor and review school performance against the 5-year Strategic Plan and the Annual Action Plan, oversee and review school policies and procedures, and approve financial statements and budgets.

At this time of year all teachers have just about finished writing Semester 1 Progress Reports. These reports then go onto each year level executive teacher to be checked and proofread before coming to me for final checking and signing. Much time outside of school hours is taken to ensure that reports are a true, fair and honest reflection of where each student is at, and that there are no other errors. If you do notice an error (eg spelling), please don't hesitate to let me know so that it can be rectified.

Last Thursday the school Rostrum final for students in Year 4 to 6 was held in the school hall. I must congratulate all the finalists for their amazing efforts in preparing and practising a 3-minute speech to deliver in front of students and staff. I am delighted to announce that Sophia L in Yr 5/6 Delta won the school final with her speech entitled 'Starting Over'. Sophia will go on to represent Mount Rogers at the regional Quarter Final later this term. We wish Sophia all the very best!



Original birth certificate, proof of residency (X2) and immunisation records MUST be provided to Mount Rogers Primary School (Alfred Hill Drive, Melba) following the on-line enrolment process.

When Will I Hear About My Application?

Enrolments for the 2020 school year opened on 29 April 2019. All ACT children are guaranteed a place in their local public school for Kindergarten to Year 12. However, due to growth in recent years in enrolments in the public system, some schools no longer have the capacity to take *out of area* enrolments. These schools have been identified as *Category A* schools and a list appears on the Education Directorate website.

You will not be able to seek enrolment for your child at one of these schools unless you live within the school's priority enrolment area (ie the school's geographic zone). All schools will, however, consider cases where there are legal issues, or exceptional circumstances based on student wellbeing. To avoid disappointment, you are encouraged to check the information on the Education Directorate's website so you can make the best decision for your family from the options available.

If your child is absent from school...

- Schoolbag App (**preferred option** ☺ – see attached)
- telephone the front office Ph 6142 2750
- a note via your child's classroom teacher

Please note - other email addresses are not reliable methods of advising the school of your child's absence.

Please advise:

- your name
- child's name & class name
- date/s of absence (today or longer)
- reason for absence (sickness or other reason)
- other information that may be helpful

If you do not notify the school promptly, the primary contact person for your child will receive a text message notifying you of their unexplained absence.

If you know of an *upcoming* or *extended absence*, please advise the school as soon as possible via Skoolbag or in writing via your child's teacher or the front office.
