FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Mount Rogers families,

I have been very busy the last 2 1/2 weeks meeting most of the 95 students coming into kindergarten next year. It is just delightful hearing from these children what they are looking forward to doing and answering their questions about what happens at school. This is the largest intake of kindergarten students the school has had and therefore a very exciting time for us. These meetings will continue into next week, along with more transition visits to kindergarten for these students.

Our staff have begun the jigsaw of creating our 2019 classes, and the information provided to Liz and myself by parents/carers is assisting us with this process (please note, we are unable to accept any further requests from parents). Our firm belief is that teachers are in the best position to decide a student's placement because they know all the students in their class and across the year levels, and have a view of the 'big picture'. It takes several goes to get classes as close to 'right' as we can. All students will find out their next year teacher at *Moving-Up Morning* on Wednesday 19 December, when they will receive a 'teacher postcard'. You can pop this postcard on the fridge so you don't forget who your child's class teacher is over the summer holidays.

I am excited to let you know that next year's class names will have a 'space' theme. This links with it being the 50th anniversary of man landing on the moon. I have asked Mr Holness, in his science role, to investigate engaging with the Canberra Astronomy Society to run a star gazing evening here at school sometime next year - when the sky is clear and the moon full! Watch this space (pardon the pun!)

Last Friday we held our last whole school assembly for the year. It was a very full and busy assembly. Congratulations to our Yr 1/2 Zebras and Hippos for hosting, and letting us know what they would like to be when they grow up. Next year our assemblies will look a little different. We will move towards having junior and senior assemblies on a fortnightly basis. This will provide more space in the hall and more time to celebrate the achievements of our students.

Last night I had the pleasure of attending the Education Directorate's Instrumental Music Program annual Bandstravaganza performance. Our Year 6 Band was part of a combined band of 6 schools who performed on the stage at the School of Music in front of an enthusiastic audience. They played three pieces, including the very current Queen hit *Bohemian Rhapsody*, one of which our very own Laura Andrezza conducted. Congratulations to all.

I hope that many of you have received an invitation from the staff to our Volunteers Thank You Morning Tea. This will be held on Wednesday, 5 December in the Hall from 10:30am. This is just a small way we can show our appreciation to all our volunteers for all they do to help make our great school hum. If you have helped in any way this year, please join us for morning tea so we can say thank you.

BABA GHANOUSH

Ingredients:

- ½ teaspoon cumin seeds
- 2 large eggplants
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 small handful of parsley, roughly chopped
- Juice of a lemon
- 1 ½ teaspoons salt
- ¼ cup olive oil
- ½ cup tahini paste (we used yoghurt instead of tahini)

Method:

Step 1	Prepare all the ingredients based on the ingredients list.
Step 2	Roast the cumin seeds in a small frying pan over a low heat until aromatic.
Step 3	Grind the toasted seeds in a mortar and pestle and set aside.
Step 4	Prick the eggplants all over with a fork.
Step 5	Hold each eggplant with a sturdy set of tongs and cook over a gas flame for about 10 minutes or until the skin becomes charred.
Step 6	Place the charred eggplants into the medium bowl, cover tightly with plastic wrap and allow to cool, about 10 minutes. This will help blister the skin, making it easier to peel.
Step 7	Peel the skin off the cooled eggplant and run the flesh briefly under water to remove any leftover skin. Drain and pat excess moisture from the flesh of the eggplant with paper towel.
Step 8	Put the garlic, chopped parsley, toasted ground cumin, lemon juice and salt into the bowl of a food processor and process the ingredients to a coarse blend.
Step 9	Add the eggplant to the food processor and continue to blend until smooth.
Step 10	Drizzle the oil and the tahini slowly into the mix through the funnel of the food processor. Continue to blend, scraping down occasionally until the dip is thick and creamy.
Step 11	Check seasoning and place in a bowl to serve.
