This week our year 3 and 5 students are participating in the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). All students across Australia in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 complete these common assessments. NAPLAN is an important tool for educators to see how Australian children are meeting essential literacy and numeracy standards. Please remember that NAPLAN is a 'point in time' snapshot of student achievement and in no way replaces ongoing classroom assessments. Thank you to Laura Andreazza, Charlene Lalor and Brendan Carswell for all their efforts in coordinating NAPLAN at Mount Rogers and ensuring that all Chromebooks, headphones and mice worked and were logged on correctly.

Our preschool children had a fantastic incursion with *Craig the Nutrition Magician* where they enjoyed hearing and learning about nutrition, dental hygiene, and sustainability. Our preschool children from Spence and Flynn spent time at Melba Preschool where they got to see the performance and meet some new friends.



Teachers from across the school are busy working on our school-based Semester 1 Progress Reports which will be sent home via email on Friday, 18 June. These will include ACT Education Directorate A-E Reports. Semester 1 A-E Reports reflect student progress towards meeting the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standard for each curriculum area as decided by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA). The Achievement Standard reflects a C grade, which is what we would expect a student in that year level to have achieved by the end of the year. To ensure the delivery of reports, please notify the office if you have changed your email address.

If you do not wish to receive an A – E Report for your child and have not already notified the school, please contact the office to complete a form. Your child's results will be included in the data for their year level and a paper copy put on file.

If you require a second copy of your child's report due to family circumstances would you please contact the office to also complete a form.

Parent Teacher Interviews will be held in the last week of Term 2. More information about booking a time will be sent home later in the term.

As the weather gets cooler can I please remind you to make sure that all jumpers, jackets, beanies, scarfs, gloves etc are clearly named. So that your child knows what to do if they take something off during the day, may I suggest that you help them by practising this at home – putting their belongings inside their bag and then zipping it up.

Positive Behaviours Learning (PBL) Program Respectful, Inclusive, Safe and Engaged

Rise Expectation catch phrases

Has your child ever come home and said a strange catch phrase? It could be one of our school's RISE Expectation catch phrases!

The staff have developed 5 simple catch phrases that align with our *All Settings* RISE Expectations to give students reminders in a quick and timely manner. Staff use these both in the classroom and on the playground, and all students have been involved in discussions about what each catch phrase means and looks like in different situations.

How do we come up with our fortnightly focus?

The PBL team looks at the data collected for both positive and negative incidents and presents this to the whole staff. After analysing the data, the staff decide on a whole school fortnightly focus to encourage reteaching opportunities and developing strategies to support all of our students to follow our RISE Expectations. Our whole school focus for the next fortnight is *Hands & feet to self*. Ask your child if they can explain each of the catch phrases and how they align with our *All Settings* RISE Expectations.

FINANCIAL LITERACY EDUCATION AT OUR SCHOOL

On the 10 February 2021, the ACT Government committed to transition away from school banking programs in all ACT public schools by 30 June 2021.

Why was this decision made?

A range of aspects were considered including:

- a broader financial capability strategy for students.
- future opportunities for volunteers to continue to support and advocate financial capability in their school community.
- declining student participation in school banking programs.
- evidenced findings from reports such as ASIC's *Review of School Banking Programs*.

Mount Rogers Primary School acknowledges the efforts of our wonderful school P&C in facilitating school banking over many years, and extend a vote of thanks to the many volunteers including our current volunteer Alix, who have worked tirelessly to deliver the program.

Our school has the opportunity to use the resources developed by the Australian Securities and Investments Commission. These resources teach financial capability through the *MoneySmart Program*.

The last day for school banking at Mount Rogers Primary School is Wednesday, 23 June (Week 10).

ONLINE PAYMENT FACILITY Now available

I would like to draw your attention to the availability of the online payment facility on our website <http://www.mtrogers.act.edu.au/payment> (access is via the Payments tab.)

This will save you time in making payments for excursions, voluntary contributions, and other activities within the school in the comfort of your own home and once the payment has been processed, you are issued with a receipt immediately.

Follow the easy prompts - the details that you require are the first 5 characters of the student's surname and the first character of their given name. This is called the Student key. A fee code should appear on the permission note.

This option will now appear on all permission notes as the recommended method for payment. We understand that this option is not available to everyone in our community and please be advised that cash and EFTPOS will still be accepted at the school office.

Enrol by 5pm on 4 June to receive an offer of enrolment from 26 July 2021.

Kindergarten to Year 6:

Every ACT public school is a great school, and if Mount Rogers Primary School is your local priority enrolment area (PEA) school your child is guaranteed a Kindergarten to Year 6 place here.

Preschool:

Every 4 year old is guaranteed 15 hours of preschool. Enrol for preschool in 2022 if your child turns 4 on or before 30 April. Preschool applications are allocated centrally, and will be prioritised according to the prioritisation criteria which can be found at the link below.

THE SMITH FAMILY SAVER PLUS PROGRAM

The Smith Family (ACT) offers a range of programs to support families and individuals to stay engaged with education. Saver Plus is a program with a specific focus on supporting families and individuals with low incomes to meet their education expenses.

Saver Plus is a matched savings and financial education program that aims to assist people on lower incomes to strengthen their financial skills and to develop a savings habit. The program provides financial skills education and motivates participants to save by matching their savings dollar for dollar, up to \$500.
