## FROM THE EXECUTIVE TEAM

Dear Mount Rogers families,

Welcome to term 4, I can hardly believe it. Students across the school have got right back into learning and are enjoying tuning into their inquiries.

**Kindy** are inquiring into how to care for special places, in particular how to care for our school. I wonder if they are going to interview Daryl?

**Year 1/2** are using The Arts curriculum to inquire into how people express themselves and their ideas in different ways. They will explore different types of art techniques and forms to showcase their learning.

**Year 3/4's** key inquiry concept is *Let's celebrate!* - inquiry into celebrations throughout the world and the reasons why people celebrate. Their ERP showcase later in the term should be lots of fun as students display and discuss their learning.

**Year 5/6** have 2 science-based inquiries underway. Year 5 are wondering about the solar system and how science helps us to solve problems. Year 6 are wondering about natural disasters; how natural events can cause rapid change and also how science helps us to solve problems. Some deep thinking happening here for sure.

I am right in the thick of all things 2023, while at the same time supporting all staff to continue to focus on term 4 and achieve excellent learning outcomes for all students. Teachers will begin the Semester 2 reporting processes in a couple of weeks, with reports ready to go home on Friday, 9 December. We have begun creating 2023 classes and the planning that goes hand-in-hand with this around teachers and classroom spaces. One of the biggest pieces of this jigsaw relates to staffing. The classroom teacher transfer round is in full swing – I hope to know the outcomes for Mount Rogers in the middle of the term.

Our annual *Moving-Up Morning* will take place on the last Monday of the year – Monday, 12 December. This is where all students move up and meet next year's teacher and class in next year's classroom. It's lots of fun and takes the mystery and anxiety for 2023 away for students – and mums and dads too.

One change for 2023 that I want to let you know about is a change in the way all members of the community address staff. After some professional learning and research around gender I have decided that from the start of 2023 all staff working in the school will be called by their first name. The current inconsistencies around this for students, for example preschool staff are always called by their first names, as are front office staff, has also informed my decision to move forward on a first name basis. Therefore, a big hi and thank you for your support from me – Felicity! This change will be reflected in communication from the school in 2023 and as part of *Moving-Up Morning* in week 10.

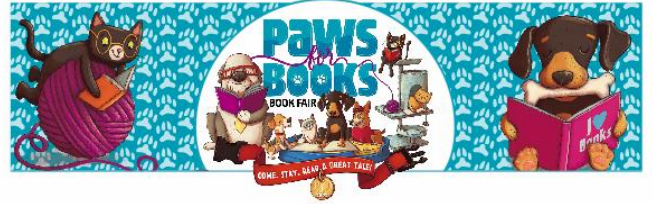
