It was wonderful to see our 8 and 9 year old students enjoy their first swimming carnival - you may recall we have not had one since 2021 due to COVID. Do you have concerns about your child's communication skills?


Attendance at a <u>Drop In Clinic</u> provides parents in the ACT with an opportunity to discuss issues about their child's communication skills. Speech Pathology Drop In Clinics are available for children 0 to 6 years who have a residential address in the ACT and are not eligible for the National Disability Insurance Scheme. Drop In Clinics take the form of an informal discussion and screening of skills and not a formal assessment. Parents and guardians may attend any Speech Pathology <u>Drop In</u> <u>Clinic</u> across different locations in the ACT.



Staying COVID Smart in 2023

Being COVID Smart remains a priority for all ACT public schools in 2023.

Apply now for the Future of Education Equity Fund for the 2023 school year. Eligible low-income ACT families can receive one-off payments for financial aid to help cover the costs of their children's educational costs, such as sport equipment and activities, music lessons, school uniforms and excursions.

The Fund is open to eligible students enrolled in preschools that are attached to an ACT government school, through to Year 12 in the ACT.
