FROM THE EXECUTIVE TEAM

Dear Mount Rogers families,

Well, isn't the term flying by and I seem to have forgotten what season we are in – is it summer, spring, winter or the rainy season!

Two congratulations to start with;

- 1) How wonderful are our school captains. They ran a beautiful and respectful Remembrance Day assembly online last Friday. It is always powerful to hear *The Ode* being read and even though we were not altogether in the hall, the sense of silence across the school during the 1-minute silence was real. Thank you to all students for participating so respectfully.
- 2) Congratulations to our ever flexible and enthusiastic Mel C (Teacher Librarian), for an amazing hybrid style Scholastic Book Fair. We raised - drum roll please - over \$6000! WOW! The Book Fair was set up in the school corridor, just outside my office, and so I had lots of fun supporting children as they decided what to put on their wish lists. I cannot thank the parent community enough for supporting this. Next year, once again, the plan is to have the Book Fair open for people to shop in person!

The creation of 2023 classes is just about complete. As I am sure you are aware, the process is complex and requires considerable discussion and reflection to make informed decisions about the best placement to meet the needs of all students. Our firm belief is that teachers are in the best position to decide a child's placement because they know all the students in their classes and across the year levels and have a view of the 'big picture'. We thank families for their input into suggestions and know that you will support the decisions made by the school regarding future classes. In the original letter to families, it was explained that not all requests from parents/carers can be met, as teachers consider the needs of all students when allocating classes. This year we received over 150 requests and unfortunately it has been impossible to accommodate them all. I have spoken to the School Board about changes to these processes heading into 2024, and I am taking the opportunity now to advise you that in the future, we will no longer be seeking parent/carer requests for future classes. As always, educators will use information from throughout the year and over time to inform their decisions around the best placements for all students.

IT IS LIBRARY STOCKTAKE TIME


The end of the year is fast approaching, and the library staff need to complete an END OF YEAR STOCKTAKE.

Educational resources for students

A REMINDER TO STAY COVID SMART AT SCHOOL

As we experience new waves of the virus in our community, we need to remember to stay COVID Smart not only in the community but also at school. For the latest advice, watch the ACT COVID-19 update (November 2022) from Chief Health Officer, Kerryn Coleman.

If your child has COVID-19, you must keep them at home and let the school know. Telling us when your child has COVID-19 will also help us track if there is an increase in COVID-19 transmission at school and manage any high-risk exposures for our more vulnerable school community members.

Being COVID Smart is easy:

- Make sure you are up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines, including boosters.
- Stay away from schools if you are unwell.
- Wash your hands regularly.
- Wear a mask in public indoor places if you can (12 years and over).
- Keep a distance from others when indoors, if possible.

And don't forget – if you have COVID-19 symptoms, make sure you get tested. You can access a free rapid antigen test from your school's front office.
