A case of chickenpox (varicella) has been reported at Mount Rogers Primary School.

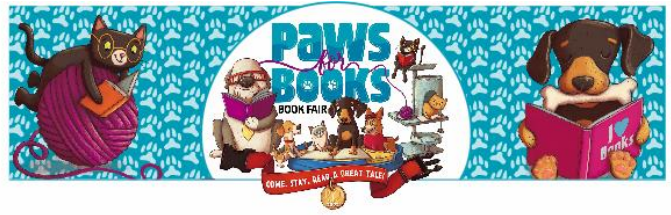

Students are visiting the Scholastic Book Fair this week with their class and can create a *Wish List*. These will be sent home and there will be instructions to purchase online if you choose to do so.

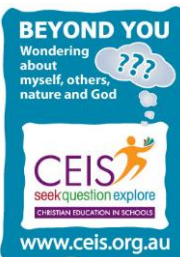

ACT public school enrolments for the 2023 school year are open.

Every ACT public school is a great school and there is a place for every child from Kindergarten to Year 12 in their local school.

Families are encouraged to apply for the preschool for their local primary school, however it is not possible to guarantee a place at your local or preferred preschool due to capacity constraints at some sites.
